Harrison Scholars

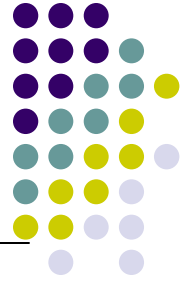
Approximately 25 new students enter each year. Only new students are admitted into this program.

University Scholars

admits approximately 600 new students each year. You cannot apply; only new students are admitted.

University Honors

Approximately 220 new students enter each year, with 30-50 current & transfer students



Interesting Facts

M

- 110 Harrison Scholars
- 775 University Honors Students
- 966 Oxford Scholars (now known as University Scholars)
- 75 Honors courses offered last year, from all academic divisions and 38 departments
- Over 200 faculty teaching, mentoring and advising Honors students
- 67 students received a total of over \$60,000 in research funds last year.



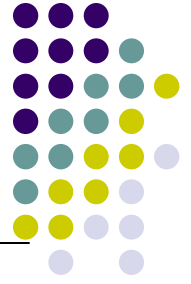

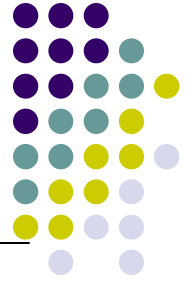


Honors Program Benefits

- Transcript notation



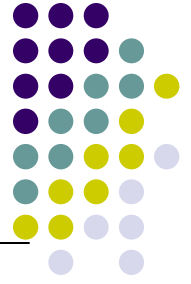


Harrison Scholars Benefits

- Contact with dignitaries





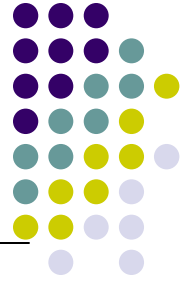

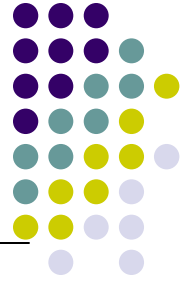

Upper Class Honors Halls

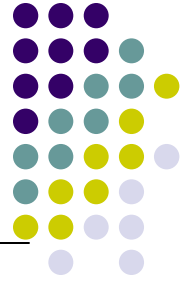
WELLS HALL
